Exercise Update

National Exercise Scheduling (NEXS) System

The Federal Emergency Management Agency's (FEMA's) National Exercise Scheduling (NEXS) System is a compilation of local, state, and federal exercises, as well as supporting training and events, and serves as a management and scheduling tool and reference document for exercise planning, training and events. It provides information on exercise or event dates, location(s), scenario(s), scope, and participants.

As you may know, the NEXS System has been offline for more than a year due to system software vulnerabilities. A notification was received from FEMA's National Exercise Division on, October 27, advising that the NEXS has been granted authority to operate and will be brought back online shortly. Once the system comes back online, a notification will be sent out to the county EMA directors.

Ohio Region 2 Collapse Search and Rescue Full-Scale Exercise

The Ohio Region 2 Collapse Search and Rescue Team conducted a full-scale exercise in Geauga County on October 28. The exercise was funded via Cuyahoga County under the FY 2013 State Homeland Security Program, included debris removal, trapped victim extrication, confined space rescue, and building shoring operations. The exercise provided a realistic training and exercise environment that afforded team members an opportunity to conduct search and rescue operations in real-time.

Field Report

The Ebola virus made October a busy month for County EMAs, County Health Departments, Ohio EMA, Ohio Department of Health and partner agencies. With seemingly no warning a simple trip home for one person to plan a wedding turned into an event with national implications.

On October 14, Ohio EMA facilitated an Ebola focused tabletop discussion with cabinet level individuals from a host of partner agencies. In a quick turn of events on October 15 Ohio EMA began staffing the State Emergency Operations Center (SEOC). The situational response increased on October 17, with the arrival of staff from the Center for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) traveled to the impacted counties to begin their assessment. The SEOC will be staffed through the beginning of November. As of November 3, there were no cases of Ebola in Ohio, but there is 1 person in quarantine and 52 total individuals who are being monitored. None of the individuals being monitored are symptomatic. Since this event's inception the State EOC has logged 27 missions. On November 4, all known Ohio contacts will be through the 21 day incubation period.

Equipment Accountability

Property records must be maintained that include a description of the property; a serial number or other identification number; the source of property; who holds title; the acquisition date and cost of the property; percentage of Federal participation in the cost of the property; the location; use and condition of the property; and any ultimate disposition data including the date of disposal and sale price of the property.

A physical inventory of the property must be taken and the results reconciled with the property records at least once every two years.

Ensure Compliance By:

Maintaining property records to include all 12 required elements and perform a physical inventory of equipment every two years. A sample Microsoft Excel Worksheet "Master Asset Listing" is available on the Preparedness Grants Branch web site under "Toolkit Assistance" for your use http://ema.ohio.gov/PreparednessGrants_Toolkit.aspx. At end of each year, all counties receiving State Homeland Security Grant funds will be required to submit an asset tracking sheet.

Please be sure to contact grant staff on proper disposal and sale of equipment purchased with grant funding to ensure compliance with all county and federal requirements.
