# Recent Evacuations in Ohio

Event	County	Date
Ruptured Gasoline Pipeline (70 evacuated for one week)	Lorain County	January 13, 2012
Multiple Fires & Gas Leaks (Order to evacuate Fairport Harbor; later shelter-in-place order)	Lake County	January 24, 2011
Chemical Warehouse Fire (Shelter-in-place order)	Butler County	January 25, 2011
Train Derailment – Ethanol (20 homes)	Hancock County	February 7, 2011
Gas Pipeline Explosion & Fire (Shelter Opened)	Columbiana County	February 11, 2011


# Terminology

- *Evacuation* - the movement of people to a safe area, from an area believed to be at risk, when emergency situations necessitate such action
- *Re-entry* - the return of persons to the evacuated area

# Whole Community Approach

FEMA recognizes that it takes all aspects of a community (volunteer, faith, and community-based organizations, the private sector, and the public) to effectively prepare for, protect against, respond to, recover from, and mitigate against any disaster.
