This is the Situation Report (SitRep) for the “H1N1 Incident – April 2009” event. Information is current as of 4:00 p.m. on Thursday, May 14, 2009 unless otherwise noted.

To date, the state of Ohio has eleven confirmed and one probable case of H1N1. Probable cases are those that have had preliminary tests that indicate an Influenza A infection, but confirmatory tests are needed to determine if the person is infected with H1N1.

**At this time, there are no situational briefings scheduled for this incident.** Assessment and situational awareness functions will be carried out within the Plans Branch of Ohio EMA this

week from 7:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. The Ohio EMA Duty Officer will receive calls related to this incident during overnight and weekend hours. The Ohio Department of Health Departmental Operations Center has been closed.

### **GENERAL SITUATION**

Confirmed influenza case numbers used in this report are taken from the Ohio Department of Health (ODH), Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) and the World Health Organization (WHO) websites.

The WHO Pandemic Alert level remains at 5. Alert Phase 5 is characterized by human-to-human spread of the virus into at least two countries in one WHO region. The declaration of Alert Phase 5 is a strong signal that a pandemic is imminent and that the time to finalize the organization, communication, and implementation of the planned mitigation measures is short.

As of 11:00 a.m., May 14, 2009, 33 countries have officially reported 6,497 cases of influenza A (H1N1) infection. Mexico has reported 2446 laboratory confirmed human cases of infection, including 60 deaths. The United States has reported 3,352 laboratory confirmed human cases, including three deaths. Canada has reported 389 laboratory confirmed human cases, including one death. Costa Rica has reported eight laboratory confirmed human cases, including one death

The following countries have reported laboratory confirmed cases with no deaths - Argentina (1), Australia (1), Austria (1), Brazil (8), China (4, comprising 2 in China, Hong Kong Special Administrative Region, and 2 in mainland China), Colombia (7), Cuba (1), Denmark (1), El Salvador (4), Finland (2), France (14), Germany (12), Guatemala (3), Ireland (1), Israel (7), Italy (9), Japan (4), Netherlands (3), New Zealand (7), Norway (2), Panama (29), Poland (1), Portugal (1), Republic of Korea (3), Spain (100), Sweden (2), Switzerland (1), Thailand (2), and the United Kingdom (71).

As of 11:00 a.m. May 12, 2009, CDC has confirmed 4,298 cases of H1N1 in the U.S., including three deaths. The following states have reported laboratory confirmed cases as follows (41AL; 1 AR; 431 AZ; 473 CA; 47 CO; 38 CT; 58 DE; 65 FL; 36 GA; 10 HI; 5 ID; 620 IL; 70 IN; 58 IA; 28 KS; 13 KY; 45 LA; 13 ME; 28 MD; 109 MA; 141 MI; 34 MN; 20 MO; 5 MT; 23 NE; 25 NV; 18 NH; 12 NJ; 51 NM; 224 NY; 12 NC; 1 ND; 13 OH; 22 OK; 94 OR; 50 PA; 8 RI; 34 SC; 5 SD; 63 TN; 439 TX (2 deaths); 80 UT; 20 VA; 1 VT; 195 WA (1 death); 10 D.C.; 510 WI).

### **REGION AND CONTIGUOUS STATES**

All states contiguous to Ohio, and those in FEMA Region V are reporting that their EOCs are operating under normal conditions.

### **DECLARATIONS**

#### **National Public Health Emergency**

A National Public Health Emergency was issued by the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services on Sunday, April 26, 2009.

A Governor's Declaration is in effect for the specific purpose of receiving, storing, and transporting the Strategic National Stockpile (SNS).

## **STATE LEVEL DISASTER ASSISTANCE ACTIONS BY ESF**

### **ESF-1 – Transportation**

#### Ohio Department of Transportation (ODOT)

ODOT remains ready to begin RDN to POD deployment of the SNS as needed. ODOT is currently collecting the Emergency MARCS Communications Radios from the RDN supervisors at EMA's request. They will be returned to the OEMA for staging. ODOT has no open missions at this time.

### **ESF 7 – Resource Support**

#### Ohio Department of Administrative Services (DAS)

DAS continues to work one mission investigating SNS materiel storage options.

### **ESF-8 – Public Health and Medical Services**

#### Ohio Department of Health (ODH)

The ODH Laboratory is conducting confirmation testing and is conducting the tests now. ODH's Epidemiology and Surveillance functions continue to monitor confirmed, suspected and probable cases throughout the state.

ODH is continuing to work with CDC on epidemiological efforts and with the Ohio National Guard in support of SNS efforts.

The ODH DOC has been closed and ICS is transitioning to a "reserve" status, remaining active, but at a lower level with the ability to re-activate to a higher response status at any time.

Calls to the ODH H1N1 Flu line continue to taper off. The line received 19 calls on Monday, May 12, 2009, of which only 15 were flu related. The total number of calls received to date is 1,578.



ODH's EOC ESF-8 staff will remain on-call until further notice. The staff will continue to perform their normal work duties until they are requested.




