Deputy Administrator of FEMA's National Preparedness Directorate Timothy Manning; NEMA Incoming President David Maxwell; and IAEM President Russ Decker announced the award winners in each category at a ceremony during the 2009 National Conference on Community Preparedness which was held in Arlington, Virginia, August 9-12.

STORMS Converting to Solar Power (From Monthly Reports)

The Ohio EMA Communications Branch is in the process of converting 100 of the state's 250 STORMS precipitation gauges (<u>State of Ohio Rain/Snow Monitoring System</u>) to solar power for battery charging.

The solar panel is a cost savings measure which will greatly reduce the number of corrective maintenance trips made to STORMS gauges throughout the state, and eliminate trips to STORMS sites to reset AC circuit breakers.

The solar panels will also make gauge maintenance safer by eliminating the need for 120 volt AC power and increase the area of future gauge placements. EMA installed 10 panels during the month of July.
