Small Business Administration and State Programs Remain Available for Clermont County

Columbus, OH --State officials announced that the U.S. Small Business Administration will be returning to Clermont County and re-opening a Disaster Loan Outreach Center at the Moscow River Valley Community Center, 30 Wells Street, Moscow, Ohio. This will be an opportunity for those Individuals and businesses with uninsured losses and damages caused by the tornadoes, high winds and flooding on March 2 and was not available to take advantage of SBA's disaster assistance program should apply. Customer Service Representatives at the Center are available for one-on-one assistance and can help with the application process.

The State of Ohio Individual assistance program will also be available to uninsured residents who have first applied for and been denied, or determined ineligible, for a Small Business Administration (SBA) disaster loan only if damages were incurred in the following specified areas: Clermont and Brown County.

Those affected by the disaster may also apply for disaster loans electronically from SBA's website at <https://disasterloan.sba.gov/ela/>.

The filing deadline to return applications for physical property damage is **May 14, 2012**. The deadline to return economic injury applications is **December 13, 2012**.
